## Woolenwick Junior School – Pupil Premium use and impact

Schools receive a Pupil Premium payment for any child who has been in receipt of free school meals (FSM) any time during the last 6 years, who has been in continuous care (CLA) for 6 months or more, or who as a parent in the armed forces.

The DfE website states, 'Schools, head teachers and teachers will decide how to use the Pupil Premium allocation, as they are best placed to assess what additional provision should be made for individual pupils'.

The range of activities and interventions that the Pupil Premium has funded includes:

- strategies as identified by the Sutton Trust Research – further information is available on the [Education Endowment Toolkit](#);
- actions linked to priorities from the School Development Plan;
- other strategies for specific children's needs.

During 2015-16 the funding was spent on:

## Impact - Year 6 leavers 2015-16

### Reading

- 87% of children in receipt of pupil premium made **2 levels progress** (expected). This was less than the non-pupil premium group (92%).
- 19% of children in receipt of pupil premium made **3 levels progress** (exceeding). This was less than the non-pupil premium group (24%).
- The **attainment gap** for pupil premium pupils was 4 terms behind the non-pupil premium group.

### Writing

- 100% of children in receipt of pupil premium made **2 levels progress** (expected), while the non-pupil premium group made slightly less (94%).
- 29% of children in receipt of pupil premium made **3 levels progress** (exceeding). This was higher than the non-pupil premium group (58%).
- The **attainment gap** for pupil premium pupils was 4 terms behind the non-pupil premium group.

### Mathematics

- 78% of children in receipt of pupil premium made **2 levels progress** (expected). This was less than the non-pupil premium group (86%).
- 6% of children in receipt of pupil premium made **3 levels progress** (exceeding). This was less than the non-pupil premium group (32%).
- The **attainment gap** for the pupil premium group is 4 terms behind the non-pupil premium group.

## Financial Year – April '16 – April '17

In 2016-17 the amount allocated per pupil was £1320. At Woolenwick Junior School 33% of pupils were eligible for pupil premium funding and the school received £88,440.

## Other children in receipt of pupil premium 2016-17

In September '15 there were 72 children on roll who were in receipt of pupil premium. These children are carefully tracked and we continuously reflected upon the impact of the strategies we have put in place. This informs us how we use Pupil Premium throughout the year and in future years.

During 2016-17 the funding will be spent on:
